Coordinated reception for refugees

People with refugee status in Iceland

- Can stay at the reception centre for asylum seekers up to 8 weeks after receiving protection.
- Can live and work wherever they choose in Iceland.
- Can apply for temporary financial assistance from the social services in the municipality of their residence.
- Can apply for housing benefits (if a legal renting contract and residency is provided).
- Can get assistance with seeking employment and making a resumé at The Directorate of Labour.
- Can get free Icelandic language and community courses.
- Are covered by Iceland Health Insurance like other citizens.

Children

Schooling for children aged 6-16 is mandatory and children are guaranteed a spot in a school in your municipality.

Most municipalities give grants for children to participate in after school activites.

Coordinated reception program for refugees

When you receive refugee status, you will be invited to an information meeting at MCC to learn about the initial steps in Icelandic society and to participate in a coordinated reception program for refugees.

If you accept, MCC will send your data to a municipality which will appoint a case worker to advise and assist with the following:

- Applying for financial assistance.
- Search for housing and receiving rental subsidies.
- Booking an appointment with a personal counselor at the Directorate of Labour to assist with your job search.
- Enrolment in kindergarten, schools, clinics, etc.
- Scheduling regular interviews.
- Creating a support plan where you set your personal goals and.
- Support wil be provided for up to 3 years.
- Coordinated reception of refugees is available in many municipalities across the country, and you would be offered participation in one of them.

If you are not part of the Coordinated Reception Program you can receive services by contacting the relevant systems directly.
